BONNEAU DU MARTRAY

Bonneau du Martray is an estate of 11 hectares located on the hills of Aloxe-Corton and Pernand-Vergelesses, producing exclusively Grands crus from Corton and Corton-Charlemagne. The estate is also considered a pioneer of biodynamics in Burgundy.

Only two wines are produced from the vineyard holdings of the domaine. A White Burgundy with Chardonnay grapes from the 9.5 hectares the estate owns in Corton-Charlemagne and a Red Burgundy with Pinot Noir grapes from 1.5 hectares owned in the Corton vineyard. Bonneau du Martray is the largest single owner of vines within the Corton-Charlemagne vineyard and owns the largest area of a single Grand cru vineyard of any producer in Burgundy.

Its reputation is outstanding internationally and its wines were served at a private birthday dinner party in 2006 for England's Queen Elizabeth II.

Petrus Advisers decided to get their own labelled 2009 vintage Corton-Charlemagne to celebrate the 10-year anniversary of the company.

American self-made billionaire Stan Kroenke, who is also majority stakeholder of Arsenal Football club, acquired the historic Burgundy estate Bonneau du Martray in late 2016.

BONNES MARES


Has the name evolved from bonnes mères, the good mothers (nuns) of Nôtre Dame de Tart, or is it derived from marer, to cultivate? The 15 hectares of Bonnes Mares lie mostly in Chambolle-Musigny (13.54ha) with the remainder across the border in Morey-St-Denis.

It is a hard vineyard to get a handle on, with a multiplicity of producers and a complex terroir. For a start, it does not taste entirely like a wine from Chambolle- Musigny – probably it has a touch more kinship with Morey-St-Denis, for there is definitely a wilder streak to Les Bonnes Mares. It is more of a compôte rather than the pure fruit of Amoureuses or Musigny. It sits a little outside the rest of the family – 'perhaps a brother-in-law', as François Millet of Domaine Comte Georges de Vogüé has suggested.

There is a diagonal path leading from the lower part of the vineyard at the southern end to the top at the Morey end. Broadly speaking the soil below this line is terres rouges; above it terres blanches, with corresponding differences in style.

Domaine Bart 1.03ha

Bart owns one hectare of Bonnes Mares, next to Domaine de Voguë and close to the Route des Grands Crus. Since 2007 they use 50 per cent whole bunches and 50 per cent new oak to give the wine a better balance.



Drouhin Larouze's 1.5 hectare Bonnes Mares parcel is situated exclusively on the Chambolle-Musigny side on shallow, clay and ferruginous red soil. Grands Crus are matured in oak barrels (80% new barrels) made from wood from the Allier and Nivernais regions.
